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ADMINISTRATOR'S STATEMENT

State Funding during Partnership Transition

Texas Southmost College (TSC), The University of Texas System (UT System) and The University of Texas at Brownsville (UTB) are in the process of terminating their 20-year partnership. Although TSC and UTB will remain accredited under the UTB/TSC Partnership during this transition period, TSC is proceeding to become operationally independent in the fall 2013 semester. Given that TSC is scheduled to open at the beginning of the 2014-2015 biennium, the reporting of student enrollment is a significant issue as it directly impacts state appropriations for TSC. Historically, reported data show that a significant majority of lower division courses (i.e., freshman and sophomore courses) were TSC enrollments. Recently, UTB informed TSC that a new methodology for the assignment of students is being implemented beginning with the base year counting period (summer and fall 2012 and spring 2013). UTB's initial projections show that TSC's enrollments are expected to be almost an exact opposite from previous years—resulting in more student enrollment to the university and much less to TSC. Given UTB's discretionary control of classifying students who take lower-division courses as either attending UTB or TSC, as described above, there will likely be a major loss of funding in the 2014-2015 biennium to the detriment of TSC.

TSC has expressed its concern regarding this enrollment issue to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, the Legislative Budget Board, legislative representatives in the Texas State Senate and Texas House of Representatives, and the Texas Association of Community Colleges. TSC is at a reporting disadvantage since it is not yet operational and has no oversight or authority for the existing registration and reporting processes. TSC is also at an operational disadvantage as it moves to opening the College by fall 2013 due to the continuing financial obligations associated with the existing partnership agreement, which includes a requirement that TSC remit all tuition and fees and all state appropriations to the UT System. In addition, TSC has significant start-up funding needs because TSC is reestablishing itself, while UTB has staff, programs and resources already in place.

To this end, TSC respectively requests to receive a hold harmless provision for state appropriations in the 2014-2015 biennium, which will minimize the effect of reduced formula funding as a result of changes being implemented to the reporting process by UTB and UT System during the base year counting period. TSC does not anticipate that this hold harmless request will be continued in the subsequent biennium.

Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC)

TSC endorses the \$1.968 billion request for student success funding for the 2014-15 biennium and recommends, as outlined in the TACC July 16, 2012 letter, that funding for community colleges be appropriated through three strategies: Core Operations, Student Success Points, and Contact Hour funding.

History

TSC was initially created in 1926 as The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley. In 1931, the college name was changed to the Brownsville Junior College and then to TSC in 1949. The main campus is located in Brownsville, Texas and occupies the site of old Fort Brown, a National Historic Site with buildings dating from the 1850's. Originally created as an extension of the local independent school district in Brownsville, Texas, the College's first classes were held in the fall of 1926 in the local high school building. In 1927, the school district issued bonds for the construction of a new building to house the high school and the junior college. Fort Brown, the first military post established by the U.S. Government in Texas, was closed by the Army in 1944. After extensive efforts to acquire this property, a formal dedication ceremony was held on July 22, 1948, to commemorate the approval and transfer of the Fort Brown deed to the Brownsville Junior College.

In 1973, TSC offered space on its campus for the establishment of a four-year extension program in Brownsville with Pan American University (now The University of

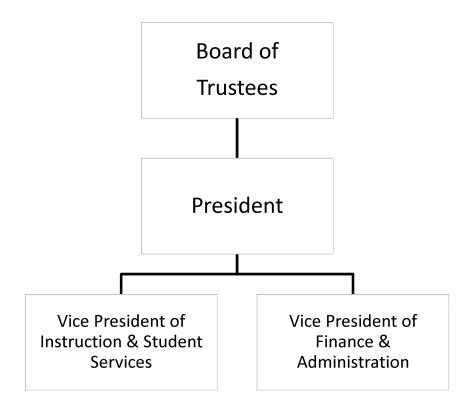
Texas—Pan American (UTPA) in Edinburg, Texas). The University of Texas at Brownsville ("UTB") was created as an upper-division university by the Texas Legislature in May 1991 and combined its educational functions with the Pan American University-Brownsville campus. At that time, the Legislature also authorized UTB to enter into a contractual agreement with TSC and the UTB/TSC Partnership was created on September 1, 1991.

On February 2011, the TSC Board of Trustees approved a motion to become an autonomous institution after The University of Texas Board of Regents voted to terminate the partnership in November 2010. Legislation was passed providing for the dissolution of the existing partnership agreement, ending on or before August 31, 2015, to the extent necessary to ensure accreditation for both entities.

A new president was hired in October 2011. TSC, which will continue to work collaboratively with UTB to provide excellent higher education opportunities, is in the process of reestablishing itself as an independent and fully, comprehensive public community college.
